Tuesday, 4 March – <u>Strawberry Production Workshop</u>

Amy Ivy of Cornell Cooperative Extension will offer a hands-on workshop on strawberry production, focusing on new ways of growing strawberries in field soil. The workshop will cover annual production systems, detecting and mitigating soil-borne pests, and utilizing biological control of root weevil complex. 9:30 AM to 2:00 PM. Wednesday, 5 March - No School Day: Track Seasonal Change at the VIC

Saturday, 8 March – Explore the VIC Snowshoe Walk

Come to the VIC to learn about the wonders of winter in the Adirondack Park with VIC Naturalist Brian McAllister. The snowshoe walk topics include tracking, winter survival, and winter birding. The walk starts at 10:00 AM and ends around noon. Participants meet in the VIC building. \$20 per person; the cost includes your day pass. \$10 for VIC season pass holders. Thursday, 13 March – Armchair Science Lecture: Citizen Science: Roadkill App

The VIC's Armchair Science Lecture series continues on 13 March with a presentation by wildlife ecologist Danielle Garneau on a citizen science project designed to help scientists track ecological trends. - On March 22, the PSC Sustainability Office will host a "grand opening" of the Student Sustainability Fund-supported VIC Interpretive Sugar House from 12 to 2 PM. Ribbon cutting by the PSC Maple Royalty will take place at 1 PM.
- On March 30, the VIC will host the inaugural Maple Sap Run. Participants will run or walk out to the VIC Interpretive Sugar Bush, fill up a quart bottle with maple sap, and return it to the VIC sugar house for processing. All participants will earn sweet prizes. Registration is at 9:30 AM. Start time is 10 AM. Entry fee is \$20, \$15 for Friends of the VIC. Pre-registration is appreciated.

On both weekends, we will offer family fun activities, a Sap to Syrup Workshop, syrup tasting, maple cotton candy, student-led interpretive walks to the VIC sugar bush, and hopefully syrup for sale.
